
So we ate up and set off to meet her (getting stuck in school traffic on the way) Grrr

They squealed with delight when we gave them our package and card and Penni got a tear in her eve when she saw what was inside.

So, we sat down to discuss how we could help Mushroom Theatre Company. However, Penni kept looking at her phone. Finally she told us that she was expecting final papers on the new building to be signed at any time. Once signed, work could begin

We were on our way home when we got a message from Penni that everything is signed and sealed.
